About the Minack: What is the Minack Theatre?



I am going to visit the Minack Theatre.

The Minack is an **open-air theatre** on the side of a cliff. You can see the sea.

I can walk around the theatre and explore it.

There is a garden and an exhibition here as well as the theatre.

There are places to eat and toilets on the site.

About the Minack: What to expect



The Minack is **on a cliff by the sea**. Most of it is outdoors.

There is a lot of space at the Minack.



It may be sunny or windy or raining.

Sometimes the sea can be noisy.



There are people who will help me when I am at the Minack.
They wear **yellow tops** or **green coats**. They are part of the **Minack Team**.

If I have a question, I can talk to one of them. It is fine to talk to them.

Arriving at the Minack: Parking



The entrance to the Minack Theatre is on top of a hill. I will drive along a lane into a big grassy car park.

There are people in the car park in **hi-vis jackets**. They will show me and the person with me where to park and the way to the entrance.



There is accessible parking available at the Minack.

I may park in the big grassy car park or the tarmac car park and walk to the entrance.



If I need accessible parking, I can park near the entrance.

The ground here slopes. If this is a problem, I can tell the car park staff and they will find me a **level parking** space.

Arriving at the Minack: The summer entrance



There are two entrances to the Minack.

If I visit in spring or summer I will use this entrance.

This is the **ticket shed**.



There will be staff here dressed in **yellow and green**. They are part of the Minack Team.

They will look at my ticket and show me the way in.



I will walk through this gate into the theatre.

Arriving at the Minack: The winter entrance



If I visit in autumn or winter, I will enter through this gate and walk down the path to the building at the bottom.



I will enter the theatre through this building.

There may be a lot of people inside. It might be **noisy**.

I may have to **queue**. If I am uncomfortable queueing, the person with me can ask the staff for help.



There will be staff here dressed in **stripy tops**. They are part of the Minack Team.

They will look at **my ticket** and show me the way in.

Arriving at the Minack: The winter entrance



There is a **shop here**. I can look at the things on display and buy something if I wish.



I can go out of the building into the theatre through these doors.

Or I can order some food and go into the cafe.

In the theatre: The garden



This is a **high balcony**.

I can look over and see the sea.

There is a very **steep drop** below the balcony. It has a fence, so I will be safe.



The garden at the top of the Minack Theatre is often **quiet**.

There are lots of big rocks in the garden. I can touch them. There are lots of plants. I can touch the plants and smell them.

There are places where I can sit and look at the sea.




There may be people working in the garden. They are **the gardeners**.

The gardeners wear green tops.

It is fine for me to talk to them and ask questions about the garden.

In the theatre: Keeping safe



The Minack has a lot of steps. Some of them are very steep. I need to be careful going up and down them. If I don't like the steps, I can explore the top part of the theatre.

I can ask the person with me or one of the Minack Team to show me the places with **no steps**.



There are some places that are **not safe** for me to go. There may be a steep drop nearby.

A **green sign** like this one will warn me not to go this way. I should not pass these signs.



Some areas have **green signs** around them. This means it is **dangerous** to stand or climb on them.

I will be safe if I keep to the paths and steps.

In the theatre: Stage and auditorium



There are lots of places where I can sit down in the Minack.

Some are on grass. Some are made of concrete.

There are **benches and chairs** around the theatre.

It's OK to sit on these seats.



Sometimes there are **ropes or red and white chains** across part of the site.

This shows that I should not enter this area. I should stay behind the chains and not cross them.



There may be people acting or singing on the stage.

I can sit and watch them if I want or I can explore another part of the theatre.

In the theatre: Stage and auditorium



The Minack is a busy place. There might be a lot of people at the Minack when I visit. Some of them might have dogs.

It might be crowded and noisy.

If there is too much noise or too many people, I can tell the person with me, or one of the Minack Team. They will show me to a quiet part of the site.



I may see some **sound speakers** around the theatre.

The speakers are used when there is a **show or rehearsal** in the theatre. They are not used at other times.

If I don't like loud noises, I can ask the Minack Team to let me know if the speakers will be used during my visit.

In the theatre: The exhibition centre



This is the exhibition. It has pictures, signs and videos about the Minack and how it was made.

It is **quite dark** in the exhibition. Some of the rooms are narrow.

If I don't like it, I can ask the person with me to take me outside.



There are video screens in the exhibition. The sound is **quite loud**.

If I don't like it, I can ask the person with me to show me the way out.

Places to eat and drink: the Minack cafe



This is the cafe.

I might have a **drink or some food** here.

This is the counter where I can order food.



The cafe is indoors, so the **lighting may be different**.

If it is too **noisy or crowded**, I can tell the person with me or one of the Minack Team and they will help me find a quiet place.



The cafe has **big windows** overlooking a **steep drop**. The windows do not open. It is quite safe, but if I don't like it, I can ask to sit in another part of the cafe.

Places to eat and drink: Takeaway outlets



There are other places I can buy food at the Minack.

This is the **ice-cream hatch** next to the cafe. If it is open, I might have an ice-cream here.



This is the Terrace coffee shop in the middle of the theatre. I might have a **takeaway drink or a snack** here. There may be people queueing here for food.

I can sit on the grass or the stone seats in the theatre to eat my food.



This shack in the car park sells drinks and takeaway snacks. I can buy food here to takeaway or eat it at one of the picnic tables if I want.

Toilets



Toilets are available at the Minack. They are **inside the theatre**, on the top level near to the cafe.

There are male and female toilets and an accessible toilet.



If I need the toilet, I can ask the person with me or one of the Minack Team to show me where they are.

UNEXPECTED NOISES

There is an automatic audio message when you enter the accessible toilet and the hand-driers in the toilets are quite loud.
